WHO CAN APPLY

• Seniors at Beaver County high schools residing in Beaver County.

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

- Covers in-county tuition and fees, excluding courserelated fees and flight fees.
- Scholarship awarded after any federal or state grants.
- If a student is selected and accepts, they are expected to be full participants in the CCBC Honors Program.
- The scholarship (if renewed) covers up to 65 credits over 2 consecutive academic years (fall, spring, summer, fall, spring, summer).
- Renewable each semester as long as the following criteria are met each semester:
 - Student remains in good standing while maintaining a minimum 3.0 GPA
 - 12 combined institutional and community volunteer hours completed
 - o 2 personal enhancement hours completed
 - 1 Honors course completed (as allowed by academic program)

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete CCBC Application for Admissions at ccbc.edu
- Complete 2023-2024 FASFA Online

- Complete Honors Scholarship paper application or online application.
- Submit the following supporting documents:
 - High school transcripts/college coursework transcripts and a record of most recent grades earned in senior year, if not already included in transcript.
 - A one-page essay or one-minute video answering the question: "How will your experience as a CCBC Honors Student help you achieve your academic, career, and/or community engagement goals?"
 - A summary of service, leadership, and involvement in both scholastic and community settings.
 - \circ A letter of recommendation.
- CCBC Application, FASFA, Honors Scholarship application and supporting documents must be received by March 3, 2023. Submit via:
 - Email: honors@ccbc.edu

A limited number of scholarships are available.

Recipients will be notified by no later than March 31, 2023, and the scholarship must be formally accepted by April 28, 2023.

The CCBC Honors Program provides an academically challenging and enriching learning experience for students to develop their potential as leaders in a complex and culturally diverse society. Honors students are encouraged to participate in learning experiences outside of the classroom and the campus and are expected to engage in meaningful scholarly research that will help them prepare for the next phase of their lives.

CCBC Honors Scholarship Winners (Fellows) are immediately eligible for and expected to enroll in Honors courses and participate fully in the Honors Program.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Challenging academic Honors courses with emphasis on scholarly research that addresses issues impacting global concerns, international perspectives, or intercultural solutions to significant challenges.
- Personalized mentorship on personal, academic, and professional goals.
- Unique events specialized for Honors students.
- Acknowledgment as a leader on campus and as a representative of CCBC in the community.
- After succeeding in 12 credits of honors courses and requirements, CCBC diploma and transcript notation of Honors Student and honors course of study.
- Special recognition at CCBC's commencement ceremony.

EXPECTATIONS

- Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Complete 6 hours of volunteerism at either CCBC-sponsored/hosted events or through outside volunteering (verified by Honors Program) each semester.
- Participate in at least 1 hour of personal or professional enhancement each semester.
- Enroll in and complete at least 1 honors course per semester/12 total honors credits by the end of your career at CCBC (as your academic history and program of study allow).



VOLUNTEER IDEAS

ON-CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES can include:

- Volunteer at CCBC events, such as Titan Student Orientation, Celebration Week, Commencement, and other events throughout the year.
- Volunteer with the Student Life Office, President's Office, or Provost's Office to help coordinate events and develop special projects.
- Work with peer students one-on-one, helping them chart their path to success at CCBC, coordinated through the Student Life Office.
- Develop service/charity fundraising initiatives for a student organization.

OFF-CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES can include:

- Volunteer with local non-profit organizations in the community.
- Participate in charity and/or volunteerism in your church or faith organization.
- Participate in a volunteer program to help local youth through a school district or local library.



FINANCIAL AD GUIDE

COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF BEAVER COUNTY

1. COMPLETE THE FAFSA

Student and Parent (if dependent*) must create an account (FSA ID) at studentaid.gov.

In Then complete the FAFSA online at *studentaid.ed.gov* under the "Apply" for Aid" menu.

Login using the students FSA ID and password

Make sure you complete the correct year. (Ex: the 2022-2023 begins with the fall 2022 term and spring 2023 and summer 2023).

Use the IRS Link to pull student and parent tax information.

Student and Parent must sign the FAFSA and submit.

*** Most students who are under 24, not married and have no dependents are considered dependent. Please contact the Financial Aid office with questions.

3. REVIEW COLLEGE FINANCING PLAN

Once your file is completed and your eligibility for Federal Pell Grant is determined a College Financing Plan will be sent to you via email to the email address you put on the FAFSA

If you would like a student loan and are a new student loan borrower or have not had a loan within the past two years you will need to complete the Master Promissory Note(MPN) and Entrance Counseling online at studentaid.gov and then email the financial aid office at financialaid@ccbc.edu and request a student loan.

If you have had a student loan within the past two years but did not request a loan on the Student Information form you will need to notify the Financial Aid office in writing.

2. RETURN REQUESTED DOCUMENTS

Once your FAFSA is received(normally 2-3 business days after you submit it) the Financial Aid Office will send you a letter asking you to provide additional information. Please return these documents within 10 days.

Make sure both student and parents sign forms and return via mail, email to financialaid@ccbc.edu or fax: 724-480-3569

If you would like a student loan please indicate yes on the Student Information Form enclosed with the letter. If you are unsure if you will need a loan then answer no. If you decide at a later time that you want a student loan you will need to notify the Financial Aid office in writing that you would like a loan.

4. DISBURSEMENT OF AID

Once you receive your College Financing Plan you can ensure that your aid is enough to cover your tuition and fees if not contact the Financial Aid office for additional resources that may be available.

Review your tuition and fees statement online at MyCCBC.

Students who have aid in excess of tuition and fees can use the excess funds in the bookstore the week before classes begin for each semester up until the end of the third week.

Any excess aid after tuition, fees and books will be disbursed to the student via check around the fifth week of the semester. Students with courses starting in later subterms may have their disbursement delayed.

ADDITIONAL TIPS AND REMINDERS

Students are required to make academic progress, withdrawing or failing classes may have an impact on your ability to get further aid. If you are thinking about dropping classes please contact Financial Aid. If you are interested in applying for scholarships please visit *ccbc.edu/scholarships*.
