Each year since 1998, family and friends have been honoring Rachel's untimely death at the age of 12 from Juvenile Diabetes. The Rachel A. Mogielski Scholarship is not only our way of keeping her memory alive, but also helping local area high school seniors continue their education.

In 1996, Rachel Mogielski, daughter to Robert and Ruth Mogielski and older sister to Tony and Steven, unexpectedly passed away from Juvenile Diabetes – a devastation to her family, friends, and all who knew her. One year later, "Moe's" friends decided to help him cope with the anniversary of his daughter's death by taking him golfing – a shared favorite activity among them. On that day, an idea sparked: what if Rachel's death didn't have to be in vain? What if, somehow, some way, her memory could be honored in such a way that also helped others? And the Rachel A. Mogielski Scholarship Fund was born.

This year marks the 26th anniversary of Rachel's Golf Outing, to be held on July 15, 2023. It is at the outing that we publicly acknowledge the winners of this award; scholarship winners and their families will be invited to attend a dinner at the conclusion of the outing. **Applications are due by Thursday, June 1, 2023. No late applications will be accepted!** Winners will be notified by June 30th, 2023.
