Ambridge Area School District involves parents and family members in the development of our programming and grants through stakeholder meetings and committees. For example, our Parent Teacher Organizations at each school level and stakeholder meetings to gather feedback on the needs and priorities of the school district. We survey parents and community members to gather feedback on where federal funds should be allocated and the best way to utilize these funds to meet the needs of our student body. The school district makes sure that they communicate the purpose and goals of federal funding and share this information in multiple languages and accessible formats that will allow everyone to participate and feel included.

How does your LEA involve parents and family members in school review and improvement?

Ambridge Area School District utilizes surveys and focus groups to gather information and feedback on how we can best implement school improvement. Stakeholders also have multiple opportunities at each of the buildings to participate in activities such as Title I nights and Spooktacular to learn the school improvement review and process in a fun and educational way.

How does your LEA provide technical assistance to schools?

Ambridge Area School District utilizes professional development opportunities through staff meetings, data meetings, and professional development days to help staff learn best practices for communication and engagement with parents and family. Ambridge Area School District provides resources for parents to help them stay active in school wide activities and provide additional resources at home. For example, we offer reading resources, materials, and books at our fall family Title I nights to help support parents working with their children at home. Ambridge also provides activities at various times and locations throughout the year to help accommodate family schedules and transportation needs.

Ambridge Area School District evaluates the effectiveness of our parent and family engagement policy every year through a comprehensive process that gathers input from everyone including diverse and underrepresented groups in our community. This is done through annual surveys that are translated into multiple languages and distributed in multiple ways including emails and "Bridger Blasts" to be accessible to all families. We have established parent advisory groups that help provide recommendations and feedback for engagement strategies. We also review the results of family and community participation rates when it comes to Title I events, school events, and parent-teacher conferences. This allows us to review and assess trends in our programming.

Ambridge Area School District will use the findings to design evidence-based strategies that are driven by data.
