### Ginger Gold Apples

Ginger Golds can be found for only a few weeks, from mid-August until early September, finishing as quickly as their season begins. Dependent on the spring season months before, the weather then impacts the apple crop now.

The Ginger Gold is known as the apple that came from Hurricane Camille in 1969. The orchards of Clyde and Frances "Ginger" Harvey were badly washed out during the floods of the hurricane. In recovering the few surviving trees in their Winesap grove, an odd tree was recognized as being different. It was planted with the rest but was found to produce yellow rather than red fruit. It is a cross between the Golden Delicious and Albemarle Pippin. Eventually this apple was named after Clyde's wife, "Ginger".

The fruit is golden yellow, medium to large size, smooth, sweet and only mildly tart.

The flesh is white to creamy, with good storage life for an early season apple.

Ginger Gold is being planted across the country in small orchards, receiving great acceptance in the local marketplace.



#### **Fun Facts**

- Apples require 90 to 175 growing days from spring bloom to fall harvest.
- An apple orchard can have anywhere from 100 to 500 apple trees planted in an acre, depending all upon the type of root stock.
